


Election of Directors:

Objectives, Organisation and Activities

The Company was established to stimulate public interest in and appreciation of the history, structure and beauty of the waterway formerly known as the Sleaford Navigation or Kyme Eau and to promote the restoration and preservation of the waterway for navigation and other purposes.

The Trust

- is organised and controlled by its Directors who provide their services on a volunteer basis as members of the Executive Board which meets monthly, or more frequently if necessary, to formulate and implement strategy and to review progress. There are no paid or seconded staff.
- is a corporate member of the Inland Waterways Association which shares certain objectives with the Trust and provides help and support nationally and locally to all organisations engaged in waterway restoration.
- is a member of the Sleaford Sports Partnership and continues to use their premises for some meetings.

produces its own newsletter which is circulated to members.

has a website www.sleafordnavigation.co.uk and a facebook page.

Review of Progress and Achievements

During the year The Trust has continued the publicity campaign undertaken in previous years. Activities have included attendance at a series of events which were successful in raising public awareness of the Navigation and, in some cases, also proved a success in the secondary function of fund-raising. These included Heckington Show, waterways events at Navigation House and Cogglesford Mill and on the Grantham Canal. The Trust also attended the CRT promotional event in Nottingham.

The Trust received funding from the Co-op Community Champions Initiative.

Press releases, articles and interviews resulted in valuable publicity both locally and in the national waterways press. In addition, visual promotional presentations were given by Trust members to a variety of audiences including Sleaford/Kesteven Rotary, Louth Navigation Trust AGM and the Sleaford Widows Group. A presentation on the Navigation was also made to a Lincolnshire Historical Seminar in Sleaford.

Representatives of the Trust attended an Inland Waterways Association/Canal & River Trust seminar in Birmingham and one on funding at Hollingwood Hub on the Chesterfield Canal, an IWA seminar on Next Generation Waterway Support in Birmingham, CRT Local Forum meetings in Lincoln and Retford, the CRT reception in Nottingham and Annual Partnership Meeting in Lincoln. Representatives attend Northern Canals Association meetings. The Trust is represented on the Witham Catchment Partnership Steering Committee and has worked in conjunction with the Wild Trout Trust and Lincolnshire Rivers Trust. Directors of SNT attend meetings of the Sleaford Regeneration Group and also meetings of the NKDC organised group monitoring vermin near the Slea. The Trust attended the Annual Town Meeting in Sleaford.

SNT hosted the East Anglian Waterways AGM in South Kyme. Richard Parry, CEO of Canal & River Trust, accepted an invitation to visit the Navigation.

Representatives of SNT have attended meetings with the Environment Agency and South Kyme Parish Council, separately and together, to discuss waterway related issues.

Trust work parties have continued at a number of locations including Taylors Lock, Haverholme Lock and Sleaford. Work at Cogglesford Lock has seen the removal of trees which were potentially damaging the structure and cosmetic brickwork replacement.

The traditional boat-gathering at South Kyme took place in May and the Annual Dinner was held in Sleaford in November.

Review of Financial Activities and Affairs

The Trust has been fortunate enough to receive monies from individual donors and raised capital from the sale of goods. The resources available are considered adequate to enable the Trust to continue its work effectively at this stage of the restoration programme. The Trust's assets are adequate to fulfil all its obligations and there are no commitments which are required to be disclosed in this report or the notes to the accounts.

South Kyme Coir roll installation: Part One

You may remember that in the last newsletter we announced that we had been successful in a bid to the Environment Agency for money to finance works to stabilise the banks of the Slea in Sleaford and South Kyme through the installation of coir roll. The works would have to be completed within a deadline and would need Land Drainage Consent before they could proceed.

Unfortunately, the consent was not forthcoming for the works in Sleaford and attention had to divert to South Kyme where we had already received EA permissions. We managed to persuade the suppliers to deliver the rolls, brushwood faggots and stakes in time for a planned work party with personnel from RAF Digby on the weekend of March 12th and 13th. Steph Munks was kind enough to allow delivery of materials into his yard and agreed to move them to the riverbank for us. We were ready to go!

On Wednesday March 9th the heavens opened and it poured all day. The water level in South Kyme rose and then the river began to flow with alarming speed. There was no way that we could work as we had planned, the area where the roll would be installed was now underwater and conditions were decidedly unsafe. The RAF fully understood the situation so the work party was stood down and dates rearranged.

Eventually we agreed on two weekends. There would be a work party for SNT volunteers and South Kyme helpers on April 2nd and 3rd and the RAF volunteers would attend the following weekend to continue the work.

It was the first time we had installed the coir roll but all has gone well following careful logistical planning. The rolls were floated across the river attached to a rope and then fastened between the stakes which had been hammered into the river bed. This was definitely wader work! Once the technique had been established, installation progressed fairly quickly.

On the second day work focused on the area near the footbridge and the water here was deeper. This meant that the brushwood faggots had to be placed beneath the coir rolls to raise them to water level. That required a slight change of method as the faggots showed a remarkable tendency to float off if given the chance! The location also meant that it was easier to carry the rolls and faggots to site rather than floating them upstream. You could have been forgiven for thinking that volunteers were part of a hunting party returning from catching a large fat snake!

Thanks to all who turned up to help and for the support from the village. The use of the Village Hall as a base was much appreciated.

The February 2016 work party undertook more restoration work at Cogglesford Lock, with Roy Thornley bricklaying, Mel Sowerby supervising and i/c refreshments. David Pullen and Keith Simmons were along there helping.

One more session should see the bricklaying completed and then it will be time to reposition the massive coping stones .

Moving these stones will require a crane which is capable of lifting weights up to 1 tonne but small enough to track over the bridge.



Editor's note: a visitor to Navigation House recently related that he was a member of a Sleaford Navigation Society work party in the early 1990s that was working on clearing trees etc from the walls at Cogglesford Lock when the removal of one small tree, whose roots were pushing the walls into the Lock, caused at least one of the coping stones to fall into the water. He was remorseful but there was absolutely nothing they could do to retrieve it at the time!
